Objectives:

During ancient period Indian philosophy was essentially spiritual and was called Brahmnical one. It is the intense spirituality of India and not any great political structure or social organisation that it has developed that has enabled it to resist the ravages of time and the accidents of history. Indian history is characterised by the idea of Supreme God, moksha, ahimsa, dharma and salvation. Both Dharma and non-violence are the essential concepts for achieving good life as well as the real goal of life. Buddhism was well known as a religion which professes peace and non-violence as the cardinal virtues. It recognised the fundamental, inter-relatedness and harmony of all life. Rabindranath Tagore was highly inspired by Buddha's ahimsa. This Seminar intends to understand relevance of nonviolence theory of Buddha and Rabindranath in the context of 21st century.

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Brief Description:

The Seminar began at 1:00 p.m. The opening ceremony was inaugurated with welcoming the guests. It was followed by lightening the lamp. In her Keynote address, Emanuel Hansda, chairperson of the seminar and Assistant Professor, Department of Philosophy, well explained the objectives of the programme. Dr. Goutam Kumar Ghosh, the chief speaker of the day, gave an elaborative explanation about the non-violence theory that originated in ancient India. He also discussed that despite being a practicing Brahmo, Rabindranath Tagore never left any stone unturned in trying to delve into all kinds of religious teachings.

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
