CHALLENGES:

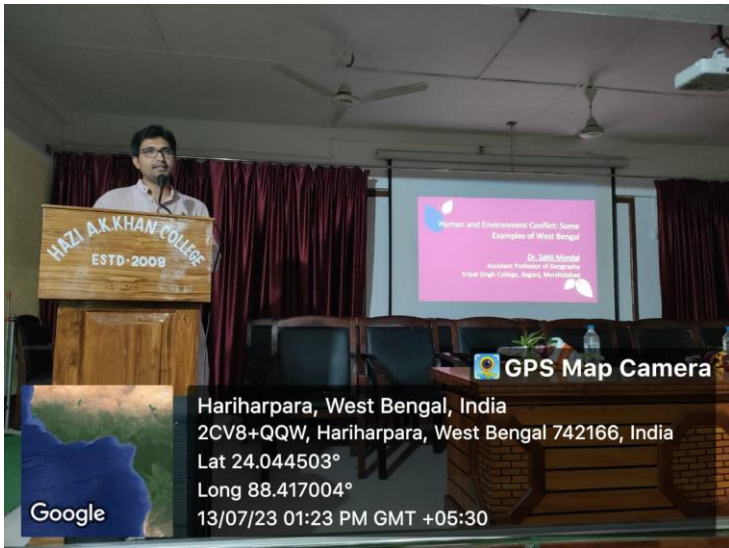
The seminar encountered certain challenges, which can serve as valuable lessons for planning and executing future events:
