Major Course

Course title: History of Early India, from remote past to the end of the Vedic Polity

Course Code: HIS-MAJ-T-1

Course Outcome:

After completing this course, students will be able to

- CO1.** possess a fair knowledge of the sources of ancient Indian history.
- CO2.** understand the transition from the Palaeolithic to the Mesolithic, and then to the Neolithic phase.
- CO3.** gain a clear understanding of the Harappan civilization, including its extent, economy, crafts, and decline, as well as early historic technological developments, the Aryan problem, Vedic civilizations, and later Vedic civilizations.
- CO4.** comprehend the emergence of the sixteen Mahajanapadas, the rise of Magadha as an imperial power, and the spread of protestant religions like Buddhism and Jainism, as well as some contemporary sects like Ajivikas.

Skill Enhancement Course

Course title: Looking into Indian Heritage, Art & Architecture

Course Code: HIS-SEC-T-1

Course Outcome:

After completing this course, students will be equipped to

- CO1:** gain insights into India's cultural and built heritage, art, and craft.
- CO2:** acquire knowledge about various types of pre-colonial Indian art and architecture.
- CO3:** understand the impact of Western influences on Indian art and architecture.
- CO4:** learn about the transformations that occurred in the post-colonial period.

Minor Course

Course title: History of India from the Earliest times to the Early Medieval Period

Course Code: HIS-MIN-T-1

Course Outcome: This course will enable students to:

CO1: Understand the use of sources, and the development of Palaeolithic, Mesolithic, and Neolithic cultures. Additionally, they will learn about the extent and development of the Harappan Civilization, historical changes from the Vedic period to the sixteen Mahajanapadas, and the origin and spread of Jainism and Buddhism.

CO2: Gain insights into the Mauryan rule in Magadha, the development of the Kushanas, Satavahanas, and Tamil powers during the post-Mauryan period.

CO3: Learn about the Gupta age, different theories on the growth of feudalism, and the beginning of political decentralization in India.

CO4: Acquire a comprehensive understanding of the decentralization of power during the late Gupta period and the emergence of several regional powers.

Course title: Social Formation and Cultural pattern of the Ancient and Early Medieval World
