ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Hazi A. K. Khan College is the lone representative institution of Higher Education at Hariharpara Block. The Block was endowed with a considerable number of Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary Institutions. But no institution was there to cater further education for the young aspirant stakeholders; predominantly the girls. The idea was initially conceived by honourable Hazi Abdul Kader Khan who donated land to set up a college. Afterwards, some local robust persons took timely initiatives in framing required Society Registration and completed other formalities with the Government. The long-cherished dream came true in 2008, when Hazi A. K. Khan College started its journey at Hariharpara High School getting affiliation from University of Kalyani with Honours and General Courses in some traditional disciplines in Arts. Very soon the institution was shifted to the present location. At present twelve academic departments in Arts are there, out of which seven have Honours Courses.
